Public Works completed the installation/modernization of 4 streetlights for one project and the planning and design for three additional projects, all of which benefit walking routes leading to Meridian schools.

Parks and Recreation completed the installation of an all-abilities playground.




Jesse Tree Emergency Rental Assistance PY22 Goal: 45 Individuals Provided rental assistance to 36 individuals.


Available Funding

Available funding includes resources from previous years that were unspent as well as the current allocation.




TOTAL RESOURCES: \$1,086,942
