4:05	Hailey Blogg, Secretary: Welcome back! <u>9/19/24 General Meeting Minute</u> vote (sent out via email) Treasure Valley Youth Safety Summit Red Ribbon Week FB Raffle	(Secretary) record attendees, monitor Zoom, take minutes; special attention to action items & votes, fall event planning (all) vote to amend or approve minutes- motion, second, all in favor, anyone opposed? Motion to pass September’s Meeting Minutes: 1 st – Anne 2 nd David. All in Favor. (Hailey) Dropped off resources for Treasure Valley Youth Safety Summit. Instead of a keynote speaker, students watched the Smokescreen Documentary . The feedback was great: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Smokescreen documentary was the third-highest rated activity (after Go-Karts, which 82% picked as their favorite, and mini-golf, which had 8% in its favor). If we discount those “wristband” activities, then it was the most favored activity, with the SRO Panel and Highway Safety PSA Workshop ranking behind it. - During the post-screening discussion, students raised their hands and shared new insights they had gained. They mentioned: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The importance of actual medical substances going through the FDA approval process, as opposed to being dispensed through an unregulated channel - Not realizing how much the industry had grown in Colorado, where dispensaries outnumber Starbucks & McDonalds combined - Appreciating the mention of how destructive marijuana growing can be for the environment - Being surprised at how destructive marijuana growing can be in homes where it is done (they specifically pointed to the explosion/fire scenes) - Being surprised at how little impact marijuana legalization has had on increasing tax revenues for schools/education - 100% of student respondents noted that they “learned something and [are] better educated about medical marijuana and the risks associated with its legalization in Idaho.” (Hailey) Red Ribbon Week is next week. We provided a variety of resources to over 20 schools in the West Ada School District (WASD). Will be attending K9 demonstrations, and still have 4 presentations for Natalie Marti available. If anyone is interested in having her come and speak please let me know . The Facebook raffle is still on my radar, everything is ready to go, we just need to hold the contest. I am still planning on announcing the winner at the December MADC Meeting.

For those of you who missed the event the recording for Recovery Day Breakfast is here.</p> <p>(David) Recovery Celebration volunteer, Trunk-or-Treat 10/24, NH booth 11/20 Finished Behavioral Health Planning Council (BHPC) October meetings, BHPC is a requirement of SAMSHA for the block grant funds. Brenda presented and represented Region 4 (R4). There are different people representing different areas of focus, the people in these positions have lived experiences. It is great to see people who have overcome these obstacles. Marianne King is the chair of the prevention subgroup and we went over a lot and shared information relating to MADC, 2CDFC, and CDH vaping info. The council is overcoming the challenges the Behavioral Health Boards face. We need to constantly advocate for resources to go out. None of the people in the room have seen a coalition challenge coin before, which I shared. MADC is one of four active coalitions in the state. The campaign is called Welcome to the Unaltered State. The documentary is set for release in the Spring. Very upstream prevention technique. In vape shops, most of the vapes being sold are illegal - they are sold from China. There may possibly be a national bill coming in March stating vapes sold may only be vapes from the US. Communities for Youth, is administering the Idaho Youth Wellbeing Assessment with community partners, determining what the needs and gaps are for youth. Questions will need to be discussed further within the schools. Parents Against Vaping E-Cigarettes (PAVE), has a great campaign called <i>The Math is Not Mathing</i>. At the last one we ran out of Parent Prevention Packets and Narcan. There is a recording on Officer Gomez's Facebook page. Recovery Breakfast: Ben was a fantastic speaker. For those who missed it a link to the recording will go out in the newsletter/minutes. Public Safety Day: great event, new location this year. A lot of engagement with families that have younger children. Good numbers this year and excellent MADC volunteers. Thank you Caylee, Helena, and Syler. (Kati) Where was the event located? (Kendall) It was at the Public Safety Training Center. We completed the Alcohol Compliance Check and Should Tap Operation, out of 7 asks we had 2 citations issued during the Compliance Check portion and zero citations for Shoulder Taps. This operation was funded through Idaho Office of Drug Policy. New collaboration with the Public Health and Safety Team (PHAST), discussing and providing resources through opioid overdose grant funding. Resources available for opioid overdose. If you or your organization needs resources let us know and we will share a contact with you or check out their online store here. With elections coming up, people are asking about Marijuana policy. No advice on voting but can provide education on Marijuana prevention. We have a preemptive ordinance as a backup in case legislation changes. Know who you are voting for and their stances. (Jake) Two shops have opened and working towards door knockers, advocating for young people to work for them. Paid door knockers and they are getting really good. (Kati) We need grant funding need for no soliciting signs. (Jake) Soliciting permits don't fall under legislature or first amendment.
